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

Director's Note

Over the last few months as I have spoken to many people, I have been astonished and a bit saddened that many do not know the name: Sarah Bernhardt. Or if they do, it is a vague notion of a long-ago stage star, with no sense of her significance. To understand Sarah is to realize that she was a pioneering woman at a time when those in her class were relegated to the role of courtesan, and women, in general, were expected to "know their place." She commanded attention and in her unrelenting and single-minded pursuit of her objective, became a 19th Century megastar – truly a first "celebrity."

By today's standards of naturalistic acting, we would undoubtedly find her grand style affected. But in the day, with huge, unamplified theatres, an elevated presentation was required. So in her own time, Sarah set the style for great acting. She was magnetic. It is no wonder that the likes of Oscar Wilde, D.H. Lawrence, Sigmund Freud and Mark Twain fell under her spell. Not to mention the great playwrights of the day, who wrote plays especially for her, among them Edmund Rostand and Oscar Wilde. No wonder, too, that contemporary stars, the caliber of Glenda Jackson (who made a film about her) and Barbra Streisand (who so desperately wanted to make one), were so smitten with her.

It has been my absolute pleasure to work with June and Elaine in finally bringing this piece of theatre to a full realization. Forty years in development, theirs has been a true labor of love. As a director, I could not have asked for more accomplished, creative and generous collaborators, and I am proud to have been able to serve them and Sarah in this way. I hope our Ross Valley Players New Works production of *The Divine Sarah* stirs some of the deserved excitement, respect and awe for this magnificent star which is her due. Or, as Sarah might have said, *Quand même*!

June Richards is a professional actress appearing at the OSF, San Francisco Actor's Workshop, Stanford University, and New York. As a theatre director and emeritus professor, June created theatre programs for Dominican University,

She has composed the music for many musical stage productions and created original music for Bravo's TV documentaries on the lives of Sarah

The writers began collaborating at Dominican University during the 1980s. They wrote: The Day After Happily Ever After, Beauty and the Beast,

The Divine Sarah, and collaborated on a musical score for Peter S. Beagle's *The Last Unicorn*. *Unicorn* was presented at ACT in SF and later received a World Premiere in Seattle at the Intiman Theatre.

Jay Manley (Director) is honored to return to Ross Valley Players New Works with *The Divine Sarah*. At RVP, Jay previously directed another biographical play, *Arches, Balance and Light*, about architect Julia Morgan. He also staged the New Works productions of *The Swiss Family Robinson* and *Surprise Party*. In Marin County, from 2013-

2023 Jay directed six Mountain Plays atop Mount Tamalpais. In the South Bay, Jay



founded award-winning Foothill Music Theatre and chaired the Theatre Arts Department at Foothill College. 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Program Note from the Authors

The Genesis of *The Divine Sarah*: In the early 1980s, June Richards, theatre artist/educator, and Elaine Lang, pianist/composer, began writing a full-length musical based on the life of Sarah Bernhardt, the great French actress. June and


Elaine were in their early 40's. Within two years, *The Divine Sarah* was complete, with fourteen beautiful songs, including solos and ensemble music. A professional recording was made, there was a staged reading, but a full production never happened.

Fast forward to the Covid pandemic in 2020, forty years later. Now in their 80's, living in two different states, June and Elaine decided to work on "Sarah" again. They rewrote and updated the script entirely, with the original music integrated into the new story, remaining powerful and poignant.


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THE CAST


