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Director's Notes

William Shakespeare died in 1616 in Stratford-upon-Avon. Three years later, two close friends and fellow actors in The King's Men, Shakespeare's theater company, decided to publish what we'd call today an authorized collection of his plays. That book, entitled Mr. William Shakespeare's Comedies, Histories & Tragedies – Published

According to the True Original Copies was published in 1623 due to their efforts. It is arguably why we're still talking about Shakespeare; it's a major resource for scholars, historians, and the theater. Two hundred and thirty-five copies of the first printing still exist and are highly valued. In 2020, one sold for almost \$10 million. If you're interested in knowing more, The Folger Library in Washington, D.C. owns 82 of the folios and has a wonderful website that has provided much of the research material for this production.

Lauren Gunderson tells a beautiful story about two friends of William Shakespeare who loved him and his work and did not want to see him forgotten. The play is also about their lives as actors and theater-



makers and about the women who partnered with them and celebrated them. It is a celebration of everything so many of us love about theater.

My deepest thanks to everyone involved in this production. And to the audience – the final character in our play. I hope you enjoy your time with us at the theater.

Director's Bio

and the Otis Guernsey New Voices Award; a finalist for the Susan Smith Blackburn Prize, Weisberger Award, and John Gassner Award for Playwriting; and a recipient of the Mellon Foundation's Residency with Marin Theatre Company. She studied Southern Literature and Drama at Emory University, and Dramatic Writing at NYU's Tisch School

where she was a Reynolds Fellow in Social Entrepreneurship. Her play *The* Catastrophist, about her husband, virologist Nathan Wolfe, premiered digitally in January 2021. She co-authored the Miss Bennet plays with Margot Melcon, and The Half-Life of Marie Curie premiered off-Broadway and is now at Audible.com. 
